The Word on Wakes

Every prudent marina should be aware of the danger of their boat's wake. Boating in confined waterways such as the Housatonic River means paying even more attention to your speed and your wake. Far too many boaters seem oblivious to their wake, often either going to fast in confined waters or near other boaters, or thinking they are going slow, but instead going at just that right speed where the boat "squats" and makes a larger than normal wake. Your wake travels great distances away from your boat and can have impacts on other boats, the shoreline and other people long after you have gone by. The USCG reports that an average of 193 persons dies and that an average of 211 boating accidents occurs each year as a direct result of someone's wake.

A few recommendations:

- Obey no wake zones don't just slow down, reduce speed to the point where
 there is little or no wake from your boat. No wake zones are there to protect other
 boaters and shore side structures such as docks and marinas or in areas of traffic
 and congestion. Anyone who has been waked when sitting in a boat at a dock
 knows how bad a wake can be to a moored boat a relatively small wake can
 create a bit of damage or cause injury because the occupants of the boat are not
 expecting to be waked.
- Don't speed in narrow channels or shallow water your wakes are larger and will have serious impacts on shoreline erosion.
- Reduce speed when passing boats anchored or fishing. Your wake can cause serious damage or knock someone overboard. Any of us who has rafted up with other boats and been waked by some inconsiderate boater knows just how bad a wake can damage the boats tied together or injure persons on the boats or swimming around the boats. Especially be aware of kayakers and canoes and people in small boats you can easily swamp or roll one of those small vessels over with your wake.
- On the Housatonic River there are several places where we always observe boaters ignoring no-wake zones or not slowing down in obvious situations where they should. The 1st is the fuel dock at Knapp's Landing in the vicinity of "R" 10 this area is not posted but there is a fuel dock and dock for the restaurant and wakes are very dangerous to boats fueling and dock attendants. The second is the No Wake/Steerage Only zone near the breakwater at the entrance to the river. This is a narrow channel and maneuverability is restricted.
- Remember, the captain of the boat is responsible for any damage caused by the boat's wake. It doesn't matter if you are in a no-wake zone or in open water - your wake can fetch you a warning, a citation and fine, or even possibly a lawsuit if you cause damage, injury, or death.

We are all out there to have a good time and enjoy the water, big boats, small boats, everybody – so slow down, be careful, and have fun!

It has current weather readings and really great graphics of real time wave height and wind speed recorded at buoys stationed throughout Long Island Sound. Add it right to you i-pad! 
